COUNTRY PROFILE



A YOUTHFUL POPULATION

26 million people
65% under the age of 25

- The population will double in 26 years



LOW INCOME STATUS

Human Development Index: 0.416

Ranked 180 out of 188 countries
61% of population lives on less than US\$1.25 a day

- 5 million people affected by the current drought



MATERNAL HEALTH

Maternal mortality ratio:

408 deaths per 100,000 live births

- Deliveries (2011) with skilled birth attendance: 54%
- 280,000 pregnant and lactating women affected by the current drought
- Adolescent fertility rate: 194 births per 1000 girls aged 15-19 years



CHALLENGES IN FAMILY PLANNING

Unmet need for family planning is high at 29%

25% contraceptive prevalence rate
(Up from 5% in 1997)



CHALLENGES IN GENDER EQUALITY

40% with child before age 18 (2011)

48% of girls married before age 18

- 40% of parliamentarians are women (2015 MDG Report)

PROPOSED COUNTRY PROGRAMME 2017-2020



HIGH QUALITY, INTEGRATED SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH SERVICES

- Satisfied demand for contraception increased by 30%
- Institutional delivery in target provinces increased to 80%
- 60% of health facilities with no contraceptive stock-outs
- 3,200 women with fistula treated



EMPOWERED ADOLESCENTS AND YOUTH

- 85% of young people aged 15-24 years with knowledge of SRH, rights and HIV prevention
- 2 million girls in target provinces with knowledge of SRH/life skills
- 334,000 adolescent pregnancies prevented
- Early marriage in target provinces reduced by up to 40%



EMPOWERED WOMEN

- Gender-based violence integrated assistance in 7 provincial centres using multi-sectoral coordination mechanisms established

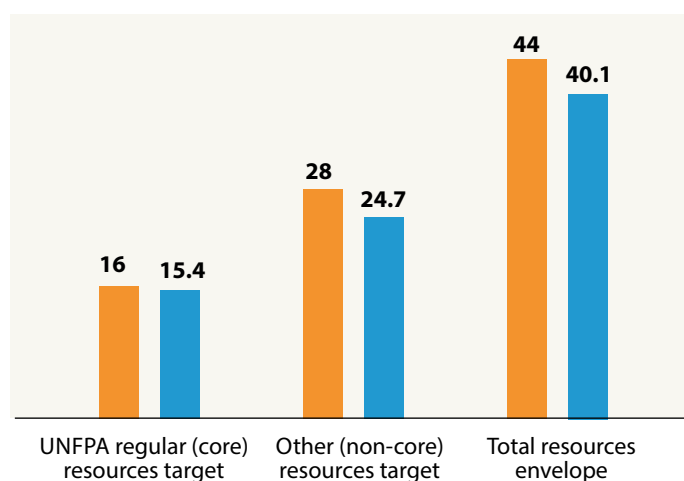


BETTER DATA

- Updated segregated population data through Census 2017 used for policy making, development planning and national consensus building on developmental issues
- Setting up of the national SDG monitoring system
- Strengthened national capacity to implement evidence-based policy
